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Amazing Learning to Use Exclamatory Sentences

Reading and Discussion

There are four kinds of sentences:

- 1. **Telling sentences** tell us something or state a fact.
- 2. **Asking sentences** ask a question.
- 3. **Command sentences** command or tell someone to do something.
- 4. **Exclamatory sentences** show excitement or another strong emotion.

Exclamatory sentences often need special punctuation. For example

- Someone call 911!
- The field is on fire!
- Firemen are amazing!
- It's snowing!

Did you notice the punctuation mark at the end of these **exclamatory sentences**? This is called an **exclamation mark**. All exclamatory sentences end with an exclamation mark.

Just like the other kinds of sentences, an **exclamatory sentence** always begins with a capital letter.
