# A Past Perfect Thing

### **Reading and Discussion**

**Verbs** are the action words in a sentence. Verbs show **action** or state of **being**. Each verb has three main parts. They are:

- 1. present,
- 2. past
- 3. past participle.

Although it might sound confusing, it is really very simple.

- I laugh. Laugh is the present form of the verb to laugh.
- I laughed. Laughed is the past form of the verb to laugh.

Next are the **past participles.** So what are they? **Participles** help show tense or act as adjectives. Let's concentrate on **participles** to help show tense for now.

The **past participle** is used with the helping verbs **have**, **has** or **had** to form three **perfect tenses**. More threes? Yes, but these are easy to remember too. All you need to do is remember the verb tenses **present**, **past** and **future**. Now put the word **perfect** behind them. The perfect tenses are:

- **present perfect tense:** I *have laughed* all morning. This shows the action started in the past but is still going on, or has recently been completed.
- **past perfect tense:** I *had laughed* all morning. This shows the action started in the past and was finished in the past. It's over. It's past.
- **future perfect tense:** By noon I *will have laughed* all morning. This shows the action will start soon and continue into the future. It will stop at a specific time.

All these verb words might seem like a lot to remember. You can make a little chart like this to help yourself out:

Verbs show:

- 1. Action
- 2. State of being

Verb tenses show **when** the action happens:

- 1. Present Now
- 2. Past a few seconds ago or a million years ago
- 3. Future a few seconds from now or a hundred years from now.

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Verbs have three main parts:

- 1. Present
- 2. Past
- 3. Past participle

Past Participles are used to create three tenses:

- 1. Present Perfect
- 2. Past Perfect
- 3. Future Perfect

To make verb tenses change into past participles, you might use one of these helping verbs: 1. Have

- 2. Has
- 3. Had
