Subject / Verb Agreement

What do we mean by **subject / verb agreement**? Subject / verb agreement is making sure you always match a singular subject with a singular verb and a plural subject with a plural verb.

You should be able to tell the difference between a singular subject and a plural subject most of the time. Singular means one and plural means more than one. Most of the time (but not all of the time) a plural subject ends in "s".

For example:

One book, many books

One lion, three lions

Sometimes we just need to know that the word means more than one.

For example:

One Goose, many geese

Okay, that wasn't too hard, but how do you tell a singular verb from a plural verb?

Most verbs don't change whether they are talking about one thing or many.

For example, take the verb run:

I run, you run, they run.

Not all verbs are like that. But again, most verbs have a simple way to tell if they are singular or plural. Verbs that end in "s" are usually the singular form, and the same verb that doesn't end in "s" is the plural form.

For example:

She screams The girls scream

Subject / Verb Agreement (Cont'd)

What if there are two subjects in a sentence? You always use a plural verb, even if the subjects are singular.

For example:

My brother and I always scream when the movie gets to that part.

O.k., when do we use is and are? "Is" is a singular verb and "are" is a plural verb.

For example:

She is going to the store. We are going to the store.

Here are two other tricky rules about agreement:

1) Sometimes plural pronouns need a singular verb. The words everyone and everything are the most common examples.

Everyone is singular just like someone or no one

Everything is singular just like something or someone.

2) If you use the words each or every in a sentence, even with more than one subject, you use a singular verb!

For example:

Each shoe and each sock needs to be picked up from the floor.
