TO BE A HELPER USING THE TO BE VERBS

What is a sentence without a verb? It's not a sentence. Every sentence must have a verb. In fact, some sentences have more than one verb. They have a main verb and a helping verb. The **main verb** shows the main *action* or *state of being* in a sentence.

A **helping verb** *helps* us know *when* the action of the verb happened. It shows us if the action is happening in the *present*, *past* or *future*. Some helping verbs tell us about the present. Other helping verbs tell us about the past. Many of these verbs are forms of the verb **to be**. There are eight **to be** verbs you can use. They are:

Am Are Is Was Were Be Been Being

Am, is and are tell us the action is happening in the present. Was and were tell us the action has happened in the past.

These verbs are all *state of being* verbs. They can also do another job as helping verbs. Let's look at some examples.

He is sleepy. Here we use is as a state of being verb.

He is sleeping. Here we use is as a helping verb. It helps the main verb – sleeping.

Is can be used by itself in a sentence as a state of being verb. Or we can put it with an action verb to tell us more about *when* the action is happening. If we want to tell about an action happening in the *present*, we would use one of the helping verbs like this:

Shelly *is swimming* in Crystal Lake. The helping verb -is— tells us Shelly is swimming *now*.

If we want to write about swimming in the *past*, we would use a helping verb such as *was* or *were*.

We were swimming in Crystal Lake last summer.
