## What Kind Am I? Mixed Sentence Practice

### Reading and Discussion

Do you remember? There are four kinds of sentence:

**1. TELLING SENTENCES** tell a fact or make a statement. They end with a **period**.

- Benjamin Franklin started the first library.

**2. ASKING SENTENCES** ask a question. They often begin with asking words such as **who, what, and where**. Asking sentences end with a **question mark**.

- Did Benjamin Franklin really fly a kite in a storm?

**3. COMMAND SENTENCES** command someone to do something. Like telling sentences, they end with a **period**.

- Come out of the rain, Benjamin.

**4. EXCLAMATORY SENTENCES** show great emotion or excitement. They end with an **exclamation mark**.

- Look out for the lightning!
