Verbs are action words that tell us what someone or something is doing.

- We use present tense verbs to tell us about now;
- We use **past tense verbs** to tell us about an action that happened in the **past**.
- We use future tense verbs to tell about an action that will happen in the future.

A good way to recognize a **future tense verb** is to look for its helping word. Future tense verbs use the helping word **will**. This helping word always comes right before the verb. Look at these sentences:

- 1. I **will ride** my bike to school.
- 2. Amy will cut the paper into circles.
- 3. Joe will play baseball this year.

Ride, cut, and play are the verbs.

By using the helping verb **will** in front of each one, we make these action words into **future tense verbs**.
